- **Virtual Community Forum III – Friday & Saturday, April 23 & 24, 2021**

This final forum of the 2020 Resilient Nantucket series will bring in experts from around the world to talk about the impacts of sea level rise and erosion on cultural heritage and coastal communities globally and what steps can be taken to address the slow-moving disaster that is climate change. Presenters will showcase lessons learned around the world and the nation and discussions will address how Nantucket can serve as a model for island-wide coastal resilience planning. The conclusion of the forum will feature a moderated discussion on the role of public policy in sustaining, adapting and preserving historic and coastal communities endangered by climate change. The “Resilient Nantucket” design guidelines will be presented, along with the resilience toolkit and show how this effort is integrating into the island-wide Coastal Resilience Plan, led by Arcadis and now underway.
